In Slaying of Hostages

ALBANY, Sept. 13 (AP)—
Inmates responsible for the killing of hostages at the Attica State Prison will be liable to the death penalty under New York State Law.

New York, which limited capital punishment when a remodeled penal law went into effect four years ago, provided, however, that the death penalty could be imposed when a "peace officer," which includes prison guards, was killed while performing his duty. The death penalty also covers life convicts who commit any kind of killing while in prison or in the course of an escape.

The New York law was changed earlier this year to extend the deterrent protection to all employes of jails, penitentiaries and correctional institutions.

The legislation was signed by Governor Rockefeller on July 6 and went into effect Sept. 1.
