Wife Says Oswald Did 'What He Had to Do'

ALBANY, Sept. 16 (UPI)—
'He did what he had to do, what he thought was right," said Mrs. Russell G. Oswald, the wife of the State Commissioner of Correction, in describing her husband's decision to order the assault on the Attica State Correctional Facility Monday.

"I'm very proud of him," she said in an interview in The Albany Times-Union yesterday. "But I'm crushed by the fact that so many lives were lost. He had such great plans, so many things he wanted to do. Now it may all be set back."

Mrs. Oswald, who has been a patient at the Albany Medical Center hospital for three weeks with a back injury, described her hubsand as "a very gentle man" and said, "I know what this situation must have done to him."
