It is frightening to see that a man like Governor Rockefeller can afford to take the political risk of destroying forty-one lives. What this reveals is a growing numbness to horror by the American public.

The climate of public opinion that absorbs Kent and Jackson State, My-Lai, and now Attica has by its silence given approval to murder as an officially sanctioned political tool.

We as UCLA students realize that until each of us participates in making murder an unacceptable political alternative, future tragedies will occur with our complicity.
