Under Civil Service rules, his pay has been restored by he has not been returned to duty. The department spokesman said he had "a clean record," with no prior disciplinary actions.

Married and the father of four hildren, the 47-year-old Mr. Harris lives at 120 East 42d Street in East Flatbush. He has been assigned to the hospital's prison ward since Jne 17, 1966.

Conviction on first-degree manslaughter carries a maximum penalty of 25 years in prison. On his arraignment before State Supreme Court Justice Hyman Barshay, Mr. Harris pleaded not guilty and was released in his own recognizance; Mr. Gold's office had requested \$50,000 bail.

No date was set for trial.
