2 ACCUSED GUARDS AT ATTICA CLEARED

BUFFALO, May 23 (UPI)—A Federal judge yesterday dismissed charges of criminal contempt against two guards at Attica State Correctional Facility who were accused of beating an inmate. District Judge John T. Curtin dismissed the charges after six potential witnesses, including the alleged victim, told him they would take the Fifth Amendment against self-incrimination if called to testify before a jury.

The guards, Charles Miller, 47 years old, and James Wade, 28, were accused of beating Milton Jones on Feb. 22, 1972, in violation of an injunction barring brutality against inmates.
