

## 2d Wiretap Is Conceded In Harrisburg Eight Case

WASHINGTON, June 9 (AP) —The Justice Department acknowledged today that it had overheard conversations of a second Harrisburg Eight defendant on a national security wiretap.

In a brief filed earlier in United States District Court in Harrisburg, Pa., but released today by the department, the Government contends the wiretap was legal and produced no evidence for use against John T. Glick.

Mr. Glick, 21 years old, is in Federal prison for vandalizing a draft office in Rochester, N. Y.

The government has indicted him and seven others for allegedly conspiring to wreck draft offices, blow up Federal buildings and kidnap Henry A. Kissinger, an adviser to the President.

The Justice Department has also admitted using a wiretap on an accused nun, Sister Elizabeth McAliste of Marymount College in Tarrytown, N. Y.
