2 Berrigans Prisoners For More Than a Year

For More Than a Year The Rev. Daniel Berrigan, and the Rev. Philip Berrigan, brothers who are Roman Catholic priests, have been serving Federal prison sen-tences for more than a year for the destruction of draft records in Baltimore in 1967 and in Catonsville, Md., in 1968. Father Daniel Berrigan, who is 51 years old, began serving a three-year term in April, 1970. Father Philip Berrigan, 50, started serving a six-year sentence in Au-gust, 1970. They were denied parole applications last month for reasons that the Federal Parole Board did not specify. Soon after that, a group of prisoners at the Federal cor-rectional institution in Dan-bury, Conn., including Father Philip Berrigan, began a hun-ger strike. Eleven of these prisoners, including Philip Berrigan, have been trans-ferred to the Federal Medical Detention Center in Spring-field, Mo., where their hunger strike is continuing. Father Daniel Berrigan is still confined at Danbury, and according to his attorney, Paul O'Dwyer, is in deterio-rating health, suffering from an ulcer, hernia trouble and other complications.
