

Berrigan Ends Fast In Prison

SPRINGFIELD (Mo.) — (AP) — The Rev. Philip Berrigan has ceased his hunger strike in protest against federal parole policies but further protests are scheduled Oct. 2, a spokesman for the Josephite priest says.

Sister Mary Elizabeth McAlister, a codefendant with the priest in an alleged plot to kidnap presidential adviser Dr. Henry A. Kissinger, said yesterday the protest would be conducted at federal prison facilities in Springfield, Danbury, Conn., and in California.

Sister Elizabeth did not say what the nature of the protests would be nor would she name any groups participating in them.

Father Berrigan was transferred to the U.S. Medical Center in Springfield Aug. 12 from the federal reformatory at Danbury, where he had been sent on conviction of destroying draft records.
