PHILADELPHIA — (UPI)

— The U.S. Circuit Court yesterday turned down an appeal by Mrs. Zoia Horn, the former Bucknell University librarian jailed for contempt after refusing to testify at the Harrisburg Seven trial.

The woman's attorney asked that Mrs. Horn be allowed to remain free on \$5000 bail pending a hearing before the full seven-judge appeals court.

Mrs. Horn, 53, of Modesto, Calif., worked with the government's star witness, Boyd Douglas Jr., when he attended Bucknell. She was ordered to jail by Judge R. Herman Dixon last March 3 for refusing to testify, but was later freed on bail pending the appeal.
