## 4000 in Rally for Berrigan

HARRISBURG (Pa.) — (AP) — Four thousand persons converged on Pennsylvania's Capitol yesterday to hear leading Vietnam war critics assail the government and defend the Rev. Philip Berrigan while a jury deliberated his fate two blocks away.

The Rev. Daniel Berrigan, Philip's younger brother, linked arms with Daniel Ellsberg, government researcher who is charged with disclosing the secret Pentagon Papers, in an orderly quarter-mile march to

the rallying point.

Also in the forefront of the march were Rep. Bella Abzug (D-N.Y.); the Rev. Ralph David Abernathy, leader of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference; Beulah Sanders, head of the National Welfare Rights Organizations; and radical lawyer William Kunstler, defense counsel in the Chicago Seven conspiracy trial two years ago.

Daniel Berrigan, wearing a black turtleneck sweater, a beret, and a gleaming silver cross, stood in the shadow of the Capitol and read a statement from his elder

brother.

"The real indictment is to be violent in any form," the statement said. "The real indictment is to be warlike, actively or passively. That alone allows Nixon to take our power and use it as he sees fit."

Abernathy told the crowd that they were assembled to oppose "political trials."
