AUG 2 2 1972 In Harrisburg, Pa., the Rev. Daniel Berrigan began a vigil and fast to protest a 19-week delay in sentencing of his brother, Philip, on charges of smuggling letters out of pris-on. Daniel and another broth-er, Jerome, camped on the steps of the Federal Building, where Philip and six other persons were acquitted of charges that they conspired to kidnap Henry A. Kissinger, the Presidential adviser, and blow up heating tunnels in Washington. The jury, how-ever, found Philip and Sister Elizabeth McAlister guilty of illegally smuggling letters in and out of Lewisburg Federal prison. "We'll leave these steps

"It is our belief that our brother is being held hostage to the Nixon war ad-ministration. He is being held hostage because I am free and speaking out argingt the
