

Douglas on 'CIA list'

NEW YORK — Supreme Court Justice William Douglas and three members of Congress were put under surveillance — apparently illegally — by the CIA, according to Time magazine.

However, the magazine said a high CIA official, not identified, denied the alleged surveillance.

Time said Douglas; for-

mer Rep. Cornelius Gallagher, D-N.J.; Rep. Claude Pepper, D-Fla.; and the late Sen. Edward Long, D-Mo., were among the targets of the CIA's clandestine domestic activities.

Time said CIA officials felt compelled to do their own domestic spying after late FBI director J. Edgar Hoover refused on "hundreds of occasions" to cooperate with the CIA.
