Singer Eartha Kitt is peeved at the news that the CIA had her under surveillance because she made critical remarks about the American presence in Vietnam during a 1968 White House luncheon.

"This is too much," Miss Kitt said in a Los Angeles Times interview. "This is more than I can or will take. I, am determined to do my part in stopping the gradual erosion of American freedom."
