Probe Vowed

Senate Democratic leader Mike Mansfield pledged yesterday that any special Senate committee to investigate alleged abuses by the Central Intelligence Agency and FBI would not become a Watergate-style television spectacular.

"Neither a witch hunt nor a whitewash will be here conducted," he declared to the Senate after a resolution to create a 11-member investigating committee was formally introduced by Senate John O. Pastore (Dem-R.I.).

Mansfield also told the chamber: "As far as the leadership is concerned, there will be no TV spectacular in any way, shape, or form."

The Senate is expected to approve on Monday the creation of the special investigating committee with broad investigative powers, a budget of \$750,000 and an obligation to report its findings and corrective recommendations by September 1.

Meantime, CIA Director William E. Colby returned for a second day of closed-door testimony before the intelligence subcommittee of the Senate Armed Services Committee.
