**Reagan Says
CIA Probe
Critics Unfair**

Former Governor Ronald Reagan says critics of the commission appointed by President Ford to investigate the Central Intelligence Agency are "barking at the moon" and should await the results.

Reagan, a member of the commission, said yesterday that "with all the immediate charges that perhaps the commission would be closed-minded it seems to me the closed-mindedness is on the part of the critics.

"I think it would behoove those who are barking at the moon to wait and, if they have criticism, then let it be after the commission has done its work".

The commission, appointed to investigate charges that CIA illegally spied in the United States, has drawn charges from congressional critics that it is not "broadly based."

"I found that everyone was very sincere and seriously interested in approaching this with an open mind and finding out if there was any justification to the charges that have been made," Reagan said.
