Senator Church Heads
New C.I.A.-F.B.I. Panel

WASHINGTON, Jan. 28

(Reuters) — Senator Frank Church was named today to head the Senate's new committee investigating United States intelligence organizations. He said the panel would review the work of Vice President Rockefeller's commission on the Central Intelligence Agency.

The Idaho Democrat said that William Colby, director of Central Intelligence, had telephoned him and "assured me that he would cooperate with the committee in every way."

After his panel's first organizational meeting, Senator Church said "we all agreed that very strong security procedures must be established" before the committee begins dealing with classified information in its inquiry into activities by the C.I.A., the Federal Bureau of Investigation and more than a dozen other Government intelligence-gathering organizations.
