Intelligence Units Told to Obey Law

Washington

President Ford has informally notified heads of all agencies involved that there must be complete compliance with the laws covering domestic intelligence gathering, his spokesman said yesterday.

Press secretary Ron Nessen said Mr. Ford may take other steps to insure compliance.

Nessen gave no indication of the President's plans in

the controversial area of domestic intelligence gathering by government agencies ranging from the Internal Revenue Service to the FBI.

The presidential spokesman said that Mr. Ford also expects the new attorney general, Edward Levi, when he is confirmed, to review all department policies concerning domestic intelligence and to point out any that are wrong.
