Senator Frank Church said yesterday the aim of his specia Senate committee investigating intelligence agen-cies is "not to wreck them

but, if necessary, to reform them."

Appearing on CBS' "Face the Nation," Church said he has been shocked by allegations of domestic activity by the Central Intelligence Agency, but added that he has not drawn any conclusions as to the accuracy of the charges.
