Rocky Names

9 Lawyers to

CIA Unit

Vice President Nelson A. Rockefeller announced yesterday the names of nine attorneys who will round out the staff of the commission investigating alleged CIA domestic spying.

Executive Director David W. Bellin's selection had been announced previously by Rockefeller, who heads the President-appointed Commission on CIA Activities Within the United States.

Appointed as senior counsel were Harold A. Baker of Champaign, Ill.; Robert B. Olsen of Kansas City, Mo.; Earnest A. E. Gellhorn of Charlottesville, Va., and William W. Schwarzer of San Francisco.

Appointed as counsel were Marvin L. Gray Jr. of Seattle, Wash.; George A. Manfredi of Los Angeles; James N. Roethe of San Francisco, and James B. Weidner of New York City.

Ronald J. Greene of Washington, D.C., was named special counsel.

Schwarzer, 49, is a 1951 graduate of Harvard Law School who lives in Mill Valley and specializes in anti-trust law with the firm of McCutchen, Doyle, Brown and Enersen.

Roethe, 33, graduated from the University of Wisconsin Law School in 1967 and lives in Orinda. He is a trial attorney with the firm of Pillsbury, Madison and Sutro.
