One out of every three Americans believes that President Ford made the right decision in appointing right decision in appointing Vice President Rockefeller head of a special commission to investigate Central Intelligence Agency domestic spying and electronic surveillance.

In a recent Harris survey a cross-section of 1,532 adults was asked:

President Ford has appointed a high-level commission headed by Vice President Nelson Rocke-feller to look into the charges of domestic spying by the CIA and to come up with recommendations on how the CIA can be made to live up to the letter of the law. In general, do you think President Ford took the right action to get recommendations from a special commission headed by his own Vice President, or do you think he should have appointed a commission completely independent of the White House?

Skepticism of Rockefeller's appointment is evident in the sampling's predictions of the commission's findings:
