Trujillo Role

One of the survivors of the assassination plots against Dominican dictator Rafael Trujillo in 1961 denied yesterday that the Central Intelligence Agency had any role in the plot.

General Antonio Imbert Barrera, one of the 14 men involved in the assassination, made the statement in reaction to published reports that the CIA was involved in assassination plots aJainst Trujillo, the late Haitian President Francois Duvalier and Cuban Prime Minister Fidel Castro.

Former Costa Rican President Jose Figueres said in a Mexican television interview Sunday that he had collaborated with the CIA in a maneuver to oust Trujillo.

Imbert challenged the CIA or any other foreign agency to produce any evidence that the Trujillo assassination plot, which he termed "an historic event," had outside influence.
