Senate Unit**Asks Secret****CIA Report**

The Senate Intelligence Committee yesterday asked President Ford to turn over CIA Director William Colby's secret report on domestic spying.

"The ball is now in the President's court," said chairman Frank Church (Dem-Idaho) following the unanimous vote by the special committee created to inquire into the activities of the Central Intelligence Agency and other U.S. intelligence-gathering agencies.

Church said he had no indication from the White House whether Mr. Ford would comply. But Senator John Tower of Texas, the Republican vice chairman, said: "I think the President is disposed to cooperate."

The Colby report, sent to Mr. Ford while he was on a Christmas holiday in Colorado, has never been made public and has been given only to the Rockefeller commission, created by Mr. Ford to investigate charges of illegal domestic spying made against the CIA.

In a meeting with Church and Tower last week, Mr. Ford promised to cooperate with the Senate committee
