## Mr. Ford and the C.I.A.

Clearly, the debate has centered not on legitimate intelligence activities but on actions of the intelligence establishment that are either of dubious legitimacy or are patently illegal. Legitimacy indeed is at the heart of the issue. The President also calls for a hurry-up investigation of the nature and functions of the U.S. intelligence system. I believe that speed here will be unwise. The matter demands patient and conscientious study, long overdue, by the various groups that are now investigating U.S. intelligence activities.
