

Reagan Missed 16 of 26 Meetings

Former California Governor Ronald Reagan attended only ten of the 26 meetings of the Rockefeller Commission that investigated the Central Intelligence Agency's domestic activities, a commission spokesman said yesterday.

The spokesman, in response to an inquiry, said Reagan attended five of 18 meetings at which witnesses were questioned and five of

eight private meetings.

Reagan's absenteeism became an issue in February, when it was revealed that he had missed the first four meetings. Shortly after that, he offered to resign, but the commission chairman, Vice President Rockefeller, persuaded him to stay on.

Reagan committed himself to many speaking engagements which tended to conflict with the commission meetings.
