

Levi Plans to Review

Assassination Report

WASHINGTON, June 10

(UP) — Attorney General Edward H. Levi will personally review the Rockefeller commission's secret report on the Central Intelligence Agency's possible involvement in assassination plans, a spokesman said today.

President Ford ordered this report withheld from public and turned over to Mr. Levi for possible criminal prosecutions if it contained evidence of law violations.

Robert J. Havel, public information director for the Justice Department, said that Mr. Levi, Deputy Attorney General Harold R. Tyler Jr., and at least one other person would review the report before Mr. Levi decides how to proceed.
