

**KENNEDY PLOT LINK
DENIED BY SORENSEN**

WASHINGTON, July 21 (UPI) — Theodore J. Sorensen, a former top aide to President Kennedy, said today that Mr. Kennedy never knew of, authorized or condoned any assassination plots against foreign leaders during his administration.

Mr. Sorensen, who served as special counsel to Mr. Kennedy, told reporters after testifying under oath before the Senate Committee on Intelligence: "It was very clear to me that at no time did the President know of, or authorize or condone any assassination plot against any foreign leader at any time."

Mr. Sorensen was asked principally about alleged plots against Cuban Premier Fidel Castro but in answer to questions included the assassinations of the Dominican dictator, Gen. Rafael L. Trujillo, and the South Vietnamese President, Ngo Dinh Diem.

Senator Frank Church, Democrat of Idaho, who is chairman of the committee, met with Representative Otis G. Pike, Democrat of Suffolk County, who heads a newly formed House committee on intelligence. They were reported working out areas of investigation to avoid duplication of work the Senate panel has already done.
