

**SENATE PANEL SEEKS  
TESTIMONY BY NIXON**

WASHINGTON, July 30—The Senate Select Committee on Intelligence invited former President Richard M. Nixon Wednesday to testify on Central Intelligence Agency operations in Chile between 1970 and 1974. 30 Jul

Senator Frank Church of Idaho, chairman of the committee, said, "In order to clarify policies of his Administration, we think he should have that opportunity."

According to authoritative sources in The New York Times, Mr. Nixon ordered the C.I.A. in September, 1970, to make an aggressive, last-ditch attempt to keep Dr. Salvador Allende Gossens from assuming the Presidency of Chile.

As a result, these sources said, the C.I.A. became involved in the planning of two separate coups in Chile. One of the coups was attempted and Gen. Rene Schneider, chief of the Chilean General Staff,

was killed. The committee advised the Senate today that it would not make public its report on C.I.A. involvement in assassinations until it had been submitted to Senate Wednesday it would not early September. This appeared as another delay in the committee's proposed schedule.
