

**Kissinger to Testify Oct. 31
On Curb of Data From Aides**

WASHINGTON, Oct. 23 (UPI) — Secretary of State Kissinger will testify before the House Intelligence Committee Oct. 31 about his refusal to permit lower-level State Department staff to answer questions regarding the handling of last year's Cyprus crisis. A State Department spokesman, John H. Trattner, said he did not know what the nature

of Mr. Kissinger's testimony would be. However, he said the department's policy had been clearly stated in Mr. Kissinger's letter responding to a committee subpoena demanding a memorandum from a department official criticizing the department for mismanagement of the crisis. The letter told the committee that the department would not release the documents, with or without names, or permit middle-level or junior-level officers to testify.
