PAPER AGAIN PRINTS INTELLIGENCE DATA

The Village Voice published yesterday a document that it said was another part of the still-secret report of the House Select Committee on Intelligence, The Associated Press reported.

The document said the committee had concluded that United States intelligence agencies were at present beyond the scrutiny of Congress.

The committee, which reviewed covert intelligence operations since 1965, also said that "paramilitary operations of the worst type seemed to come from outside" the Central Intelligence Agency and were ordered by President Nixon and Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger, The Village Voice report said.

The Village Voice, a New York City weekly newspaper, published last week what it said was the investigative section of the committee's report. Daniel Schorr, a CBS newsman, has said he supplied the newspaper with a copy of the report.

The paper said that it was publishing the material printed yesterday because it provided perspective for understanding the reaction of Administration officials to the section it published last week.
