

**PUEBLO IS SHIFTED  
BY NORTH KOREANS**

WASHINGTON, May 9 (AP) —The North Koreans have moved the captured United States intelligence ship Pueblo from the port of Wonsan to another place, State Department officials said today.

The officials who gave this information to newsmen declined to give further details, except to say that the vessel was moved without its American crew.

The 82 surviving crewmen are still being held, possibly in several places. United States representatives have repeatedly called on the North Koreans to return the ship and its men, without result.

The last United States-North Korean meeting at the Panmun-

jom truce site took place Tuesday night. It was the 16th meeting on the subject since the ship was seized on Jan. 23.

The State Department officials, who stipulated that they not be quoted by name, declined to hint where the Pueblo was now or to say how the United States knows it had been moved.

They also declined comment on whether the United States carries on aerial surveillance over North Korea.
