Rogala's replies indicated Bucher knew what the commanders of the North Korean ships were planning before the surrender and was ra-dioing these plans to naval

• "Were there intelligence personnel on board the Pueblo interpreting radio messages between the attacking North Korean ships?"

• "Were those messages
