NEW YORK AP - The wife of the commander of the captured Navy intelligence ship Pueblo said Monday she wished the United States had retaliated for the capture, even if it cost her husband's life.

Mrs. Lloyd Bucher said "some military action" should have been taken during the first 24 hours after North Korea captured the ship.

"I would have felt better that way, even myself, knowing that my husband, if he was to lose his life, that at least our country did something for them," she said.

Mrs. Bucher was interviewed on NBC television network's "Today" show.
