"IN 1959," HE SAID, "I WENT TO RUSSIA MYSELF IN ALL INNOCENCE."

SHE SAID SHE THOUGHT IT WAS "SAFE TO ASSUME" THAT RUSSIAN

INTELLIGENCE WAS AWARE OF THE STUDENT GROUP'S AFFILIATION WITH THE CIA.

MISS MURPHY RECALLED A TOUR BY HUNGARIAN FREEDOM FIGHTERS IN 1956 AND A TOUR BY A RUSSIAN EXCHANGE GROUP IN 1958.

"BOTH TIMES I WAS THE PUBLIC RELATIONS PERSON SUPPOSED TO HANDLE THE VISITORS," SHE SAID, "BUT IN EACH INSTANCE OUTSIDERS WERE BROUGHT IN TO DO THE JOB. IT SEEMS OBVIOUS NOW THEY WERE CIA." SM1236PES
