

200 Protest Coup in Chile By Military

About 200 demonstrators protested the death of Chilean president Salvador Allende and the military takeover of his government in a noon picket line at the Executive Office Building yesterday.

Speakers from the group charged that American intervention led to the coup Tuesday and demanded that no U.S. support be given the military regime.

They also demanded that the Senate Foreign Relations Committee obtain from Dr. Henry A. Kissinger a full account of past intervention and a pledge of no future involvement in Chilean affairs by the U.S., before he is confirmed as Secretary of State.

The group, called the Non-Intervention of Chile Association, was a hastily formed coalition of local groups including the Vietnam Veterans Against the War, Youth Against War and Fascism, the Community for Creative Non-Violence, United Farm Workers, United Mine Workers and the Common Front for Latin America.
