Widow of Allende Leaves Mexico for Visit in Cuba

MEXICO CITY, Sept. (Reuters)—The widow of the former Chilean President, Salvador Allende Gossens, flew to Cuba today for a visit. She was accompanied by the Cuban Ambassador to Mexico, Fer-nando López Muino.

A family spokesman said that Mrs. Allende would visit her daughter, Beatriz, who is the wife of a Cuban diplomat and left Santiago shortly after the military coup that deposed her father. She is expecting a baby.

Mrs. Allende is expected to return to Mexico in about a week.
