

Missing American

May Be Dead in Chile

CHICAGO, Oct. 3 (UPI)—
The body of a man identified as missing American student Frank Teruggi Jr. of Chicago, has been found in Santiago, Chile, the office of Sen. Adlai Stevenson (D-Ill.) said today.

He is the first American reported killed since the Chilean coup.

"We have a report from the State Department that the body of a young man was that of Mr. Teruggi," a spokesman said. "The State Department is now awaiting reconfirma-

tion," presumably in the form of dental records. There were no further details.

Teruggi, who was studying economics in Santiago, had been missing since Sept. 21, the day after his arrest by the

armed forces.

Frank Teruggi Sr., the youth's father, said last night he had talked to his son's roommate, David Hathaway after Hathaway returned to New York from Santiago.

"Hathaway told me the police came to their house in a Santiago suburb Sept. 20 and arrested them," Teruggi said. "They were taken to the soccer stadium, and the next day, Hathaway said the police read

a list of names—including Frank's.

"Hathaway said Frank was taken to another part of the stadium and nobody seems to know what happened to him after that."
