American's Mysterious Chile Death

Santiago

An army officer said yesterday that Frank R. Teruggi, an American student arrested and later found dead, had been shot, but that the fatal wounds were not from a type of weapon used by Chilean soldiers.

Teruggi was the first American known to have died in Chile since the military coup of September 11 that overthrew President Salvador Allende. He had been in the country two years studying economics at the University of Chile.

His body lay unclaimed in the Santiago morgue for 12 days before being identified by the U.S. embassy. 3 OCT

The army colonel in charge of the improvised prison camp at the national stadium said Teruggi was taken to the stadium September 21 after being picked up for curfew violation, but was released the next day.

Teruggi's body was found in the street September 22 and taken to the morgue, the officer said. He said the prison camp doctor went to the morgue to inspect the body after it was tentatively identified as that of Teruggi and said it had bullet wounds from a submachine gun of smaller caliber than the 9-mm. type used by the Chilean armed forces.
