Soviet Union Approves Of New Cuba Situation

From News Dispatches

The Soviet Union last night displayed satisfaction with the new climate that is taking shape in the relations between Cuba and the American continents.

The official government newspaper Izvestia noted in Moscow that a "broad movement for recognition of Cuba" was developing in Latin America. The newspaper pointed out that even in the United States some voices have be-come more insistent in calling

for a re-examingation of policy toward Cuba.

Meanwhile, Ecuador's President, Gen. Guillermo Rodriguez Lara, said in Quito, that his government favored lifting the economic and diplomatic blockade imposed on Cuba by the Organization of American States in 1964.

(In Bogota yesterday, Costa Rican Foreign Minister Gon-zalo Facio said his country, Colombia and possibly Venezuela would ask the OAS permanent council next week to lift the blockade.)
