Ford Names New Envoy To Spain

Washington

President Ford yesterday announced he is nominating Peter Flanigan, a key adviser to former President Richard Nixon, to be ambassador to Spain.

If confirmed by the Senate, Flanigan would succeed Horacio Rivero.

Flanigan was a vice president of an investment banking firm when he joined the Nixon administration in 1969 as an assistant to the president.

Mr. Ford also said he will nominate veteran diplomat Edward S. Little to be ambassador to the Republic of Chad, succeeding Edward W. Mulcahy, now deputy assistant secretary of state for African affairs.

Little currently is acting coordinator of the State Department office of Cuban affairs.
