Ford's Rating Slips

President Ford's performance rating has slipped five points after he had enjoyed a sharp but brief surge in popularity following his signing of the tax rebate

In the latest measurement, 39 per cent approve, a figure which matches Mr. Ford's average rating for the current year. In the previous survey, conducted shortly after the tax bill became law; the President's rating was 44 per cent.

The President's latest approval rating was recorded following the fall of Cambodia and at a time of growing certainty that the government of South Vietnam would collapse. Mr. Ford won public support for his proposal to send humanitari-

an aid to South Vietnam but was overwhelmingly o pposed on his proposal to se nd military aid.

The views of the public were also sought regarding the President's handling of the economic situation. The current survey shows disapproval outweighing approval by a 2-to-1 margin, with little change having occurred since a late January-eacpy February survey.

While Mr. Ford's current rating on the economy matches the rating given him in the earlier survey, some evidence is found that Mr. Ford's signing of the tax cut bill map have contributed to an increase in the public's optimism regarding the economy.

While the weight of opinion continued to be bearish, the percentage of Americans who (in a late March survey) said the economic situation would get better had increased to a high point of 35 per cent, an increase of five points since the previous survey.

Following is the question that has been asked during the last 35 years to measure presidential popularity:

"Do you approve or disapprove of the way (name of incumbent) is handling his job as President?"
