

**Ford Says He Would Want  
Kissinger in Future Cabinet**

WASHINGTON, Feb. 9 (AP)—President Ford has said he would ask Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger to remain in the Cabinet if Mr. Ford is elected President for a full term, the White House press secretary, Ron Nessen, acknowledged today.

Nessen confirmed that Mr. Ford made such a statement in an interview with The Christian Science Monitor.

Asked if the President had communicated his desire to Mr. Kissinger, Mr. Nessen said: "I fell sure that Dr. Kissinger knows his feelings."

In the interview, Mr. Nessen said, Mr. Ford also indicated that as former governors, both Ronald Reagan and John B. Connally would be qualified to serve as his vice presidential running mate. The President was quoted as saying that Carla A. Hills, secretary of Housing and Urban Development, would also be qualified.
