LANE WAS IN ROME TO PUBLICIZE THE ITALIAN EDITION OF HIS BOOK "RUSH TO JUDGMENT," WHICH CHALLENGES THE REPORT OF THE WARREN COMMISSION THAT PRESIDENT KENNEDY WAS KILLED BY LEE HARVEY OSWALD ACTING ALONE.

ASKED IF HE THOUGHT GARRISON'S INVESTIGATION SUPPORTED HIS THESIS, LANE SAID: "I DEFINITELY DO."

HE SAID HE HOPED GARRISON WOULD NOT TURN THE INVESTIGATION OVER TO THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT BECAUSE "ALLTHEY CAN DO NOW IS INTERFERE WITH GARRISON'S WORK."
