Mexico City, March 3 (AP)- A Cuban exile leader claimed today that Mexican police and the Cuban embassy in Mexico have information on Lee Harvey Oswald that would further the New Orleans probe into the death of President John F. Kennedy.

"It would not surprise me if the name of Fidel Castro appears in the investigations of the district attorney's office in New Orleans," Alberto Garcia Menocal told a news conference.

Garcia Menocal, secretary-general of the Association of Businessmen, Industrialists and Professional Men of Cuba in Mexico, referred to Dist. Atty Jim Garrison's widening probe, in which four persons have been subpoenaed.

He declared the Cuban embassy "has not told a fifth part" of its relations with Oswald before the President was assassinated and said the Mexican police have additional information on activities in Mexico of Oswald, the man the Warren Commission said shot Kennedy.

Garcia Menocal said Oswald had visited Mexico trying to get a visa to visit Cuba. He said the Cuban embassy in Mexico channels instructions to pro-Castro organizations in the United States, such as "fair play for Cuba" to which Oswald is said to have belonged.
