## Ex-Oswald Lawyer Pleads

NEW ORLEANS - (UPI) - Attorney Dean Andrews who once represented Lee Harvey Oswald, pleaded innocent today to a perjury indictment growing out of a Grand Jury investigation of an alleged conspiracy toassassinatePresidentKennedy.

suburban Jefferson Parish, appearing without the dark glasses he refers to as his trade mark, requested and was granted a jury trial.

Judge Frank J. Shea gave defense attorneys until April 10 to file motions.

The indictment charged Andrews with "willfully and unia wfully" giving false-boods to the Grand Jury March 16.
