Perjury Indictment Move

New Orleans

An attorney for Dean Andrews asked Criminal District Court yesterday to dismiss a perjury indictment against his client stemming from Andrews' testimony before a grand jury investigating the Kennedy assassination.

Judge Frank Shea set April 17 for the motion.

Andrews' attorney, Sam Zelden, alleged that the perjury indictment does not comply with Louisiana's code of criminal procedure.

Andrews, an attorney, once told the Warren Commission that a "Clay Bertrand" ask-

ed him in a telephone call to defend Lee Harvey Oswald in Dallas

District Attorney Jim Garrison claims that Bertrand is an alias used by Clay L. Shaw, a New Orleans busi-

nessman indicted by the grand jury on charges of conspiring to kill Mr. Kennedy.

Andrews has said he does not know if Shaw and Bertrand are the same man.
