NEW ORLEANS, APRIL 19 (AP)-DEAN A. ANDREWS JR., A LAWYER TWICE INDICTED BY THE ORLEANS PARISH GRAND JURY IN CONNECTION WITH THE PROBE OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY'S ASSASSINATION HAS FILED A \$100,000 DAMAGE SUIT AGAINST DIST. ATTY. JIM GARRISON.

ANDREWS CLAIMED IN THE SUIT FILED YESTERDAY IN U.S. DISTRICT COURT THAT GARRISON HAD DEPRIVED HIM OF HIS CIVIL RIGHTS.

HE CHARGED IN THE SUIT THAT GARRISON HAD PLACED HIM BEFORE THE GRAND JURY AND COMPELLED HIM "TO ANSWER QUESTIONS DESIGNED TO TRAP HIM, FULLY KNOWING THAT PLAINTIFF HAD NO KNOWLEDGE OF ANY CONSPIRACY OR ANY FACTS MATERIAL TO A CONSPIRACY TO MURDER JOHN F. KENNEDY."

THE SUIT WAS FILED SHORTLY AFTER ANDREWS PLEADED INNOCENT TO CHARGES HE COMMITTED PERJURY BEFORE THE GRAND JURY.

ANDREWS FURTHER ALLEGED GARRISON SOUGHT TO DISCREDIT HIM BY OFFERING HIM SODIUM PENTOTHAL, HYPNOSIS AND A LIE DETECTOR TEST.

ANDREWS TESTIFIED BEFORE THE WARREN COMMISSION THAT A CLAY BERTRAND CONTACTED HIM BY PHONE AFTER THE 1963 ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY AND ASKED HIM TO REPRESENT LEE HARVEY OSWALD IN DALLAS.

IN THE SUIT, ANDREWS CONTENDED HE TOLD GARRISON LAST DECEMBER HE COULD NOT IDENTIFY CLAY SHAW AS THE MAN HE KNEW AS CLAY BERTRAND.

SHAW IS A WEALTHY, RETIRED BUSINESSMAN WHO IS CHARGED WITH CRIMINAL CONSPIRACY TO MURDER KENNEDY. GARRISON ACCUSED SHAW OF USING THE ALIAS BERTRAND IN PLOTTING THE ASSASSINATION. SHAW, WHO PLEADED INNOCENT AT HIS ARRAIGNMENT AND DENIED EVER USING AN ALIAS, IS FREE ON BOND.
