ANDREWS TOLD THE WARREN COMMISSION THAT A VOICE HE RECOGNIZED AS CLAY BERTRAND TELEPHONED HIM SHORTLY AFTER THE KENNEDY ASSASSINATION AND ASKED HIM TO GO TO DALLAS AND REPRESENT LEE HARVEY OSWALD. ANDREWS SAID HE WAS SICK AND DECLINED TO GO.

JUDGE SHEA ALSO DENIED TODAY MOTIONS BY ANDREWS FOR AN IMMEDIATE TRIAL AND THAT HE BE FURNISHED COPIES OF HIS TESTIMONY BEFORE THE GRAND JURY.
