## Garrison Men Cleared of **Bribe Charges**

6-15 New Orleans Two investigators were cleared by police yesterday of trying to bribe a man into shoring up District Attorney Jim Garrison's Kennedy assassination probe.

Deputy police superintend-ent Presly Trosclair said Al-vin Beauboeuf was offered money and a job in exchange for corroborative evidence, was sincerely believed he had — but that such offers were not unusual police procedure.

No bribe was intended, No bride was intended, Trosclair said, and the police investigation showed no evi-dence to back Beauboeuf's claim that he was threatened if he disclosed the offer. Associated Press

The Rev. Clyde Johnson, who ran for governor of Loui-siana in 1963, is from Kent-wood, La., birthplace of Clay L. Shaw, businessman ac-cused by Garrison.
