NBC announced it will air a program monday night caying that two principal witnesses in Garrison's case against Clay L. Shaw, retired New Orleans businessman, has previously failed lie detector tests.

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The network said thaw was held for trial on a charge of conspiring to assassinate Kennely largely because of the testimony of the witnesses, Vernon Bundy and Perry Russo.

Garrison's letter to Rosel H. Hyde, chairman of the ECC, charged that ABC had some beyond "the pretence of merely exthering and disseminating the news," the Times-Picayune Laid.
