Warren of Trying To'Dynamite' Case NEW ORLEANS, Sept.

(AP) - District Attorney Jim Grrison has accused Chief Justice Earl Warren of trying to "dynamite" his investigation into the assassination of Presiden Kennedy.

Justice Warren told newsmen in Tokyo Monday he had not seen a single fact-including data compiled by Mr. Garrison -to contradict the Warren Commission's report on the assassination.

Mr. Garrison contends that Mr. Garrison contends that Clay L. Shaw, New Orleans busi essman, conspired with Le Harvey Oswald and others to murder President Kennedy. The Warren Commission decided th Oswald had acted alone.

"It is a little disconcerting." said Mr. Garrison, "to find the Chief Justice of the United States on his hands and knees described to obtain a cease-fire between Israel and the Arab states.

Named Foreign Minister

COPENHAGEN. Denmark, Sept. 6—Hans Tabor, Danish Ambassador to the United Nations since 1964, was appointed Foreign Minister by Premier Vens Otto Krag to-day. He will take office Oct. 2, when he and the Premier return from the General Assembly meeting opening later this month.

The appointment of the 45-year-old diplomat is unusual in that he is not a member of the Folketing (Parliament). Mr. Tabor, chairman of the Security Council during the Middle Eastern crisis in June, helped to obtain a cease-fire between Israel and the Arab states.
